## Grading Rubric Learning Assessment #8 – Concept Map

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Because of the nature of this learning assessment, the concept maps were graded using a classic scoring rubric rather the usual checklist style. The rubric explicitly states the criteria required at each level of performance. Students are provided with the rubric when they are given the assignment and marked assignments are returned with copies of the rubric detailing the breakdown of the final grade.

This grading rubric, like the checklist style, is an effective way to ensure that grading is transparent to the students and that consistency is maintained amongst multiple graders.
