Our last Field Conference was in 2022. It was a success, but attendance was lower than we expected. Since then we have not been able to organize another event. We are currently planning two events: a Zoom talk on coastal geology, and a weekend conference aimed at K-12 teachers.

Detailed report

Other Section activities

- Working with volunteers (already identified), we will hold a weekend field conference aimed at California K-12 teachers, especially those in Northern California.
- Hold a Zoom talk on Coastal Geology (the speaker has already volunteered). Try to recruit more speakers, and make the talks a semi-regular event.
- Identify and recruit regional leaders, who can hold regional events. To start with, the regions will be states (Hawaii, Nevada, and Arizona) with California being split between Northern California and Southern California.
