TWO-DAY IN-PERSON WORKSHOPS

Engage everyone in your department, program, or network in reflection and action to make your culture, curriculum, and/or courses more effective and inclusive. Themes include:

- Building stronger geoscience and environmental science departments and programs
- Strengthening interdisciplinary environmental/sustainability programs
- Supporting the success of all students
- Making your courses more effective
- Becoming an inclusive geoscience leader (for graduate students)

Fee: \$5000

plus travel and lodging expenses for two leaders

MULTI-SESSION VIRTUAL WORKSHOPS

These virtual workshops address more specific topics and are held in two or three 2-hour sessions over a few weeks. Topics include:

- Inclusive mentoring
- Making your courses more effective
- Making large-enrollment introductory courses equitable and effective
- Supporting and developing strong teaching assistants

Fee: \$2500

SINGLE-SESSION VIRTUAL WORKSHOPS

Single-session virtual workshops cover topics that introduce a specific practice or set of resources in a 3-hour session. Available topics include:

- Connecting courses and curricula to geoscience workforce skills
- Marketing your geoscience program

Fee: \$1000
